

Do you pay income tax?

If you do the Government will add 28p to every £1 that you put in your envelope if you sign the attached Gift Aid form and return it to me.

Unlike the old Deeds of Covenant, by signing a Gift Aid form you do not commit to giving a fixed amount to the Church and you may increase, reduce or cancel your contributions at any time. The form lasts indefinitely therefore you do not have to sign any further forms and unless you are a higher rate taxpayer you need not put details on your tax return. (However if you are a higher rate taxpayer you will receive a personal refund for the difference between 22% and 40% on anything you give)

Please note that if you cease to pay income tax at any time in the future you must tell the church treasurer straight away so that the Gift Aid form can be cancelled.
